# **SERVING THE LEAST-REACHED\***

\*Those with little or no access to a church that proclaims the gospel in their language and worships in a culturally relevant way

In 2019, more than 18,000 daily prayer partners, 188 sending churches and 9,972 financial donors joined hands with Christar to cultivate Christ-honoring transformation in least-reached communities around the world! Thank you for serving with us.

#### Together, we:

- Supported 90 teams worldwide with over 280 long-term field workers
- Launched 30 new workers to begin cross-cultural service
- Enabled 20 short-term workers to invest in ministry alongside long-term teams
- Invested in 219 students through special internship projects
- Served among more than 70 people groups in 30 countries

# CHURCH PLANTING: TREMENDOUS JOY

After 8½ challenging years of church planting in Albania, Christar worker Randy\*\* had an encouraging revelation as he scanned the group of musicians leading worship during a morning service:

> "Nobody from our [expat] team was up front. It was all young people who had come to the Lord through [this] ministry leading worship!"

Likewise, the men who led the service and preached the sermon were local believers, both mentored by Randy's teammates. By God's grace, the church was becoming independent—and that, for a church planter, is a tremendous joy!





# UNDERSTANDING THE CYCLE

The vision of Christar is to cultivate Christ-Honoring transformation in communities where He is yet to be worshiped.

The Cycle of Christ-Honoring Transformation in Communities begins when God calls some of His people to take the gospel across cultures, to those who have little or no access to the good news. A team of believers lives as the Body of Christ in a least-reached community, and members of this team use their gifts and skills to meet needs while proclaiming the message of Jesus.

By God's grace, these efforts bring forth fruit as members of the community trust in Christ and are drawn to worship with other members of their community in their own language and culture. As they mature in their faith, these believers develop a biblical worldview that propels them to reach out to others—and the cycle begins anew.

# IN THE WAKE OF DEVASTATION

"I know God, and I know He will not leave me and will not let me go. I will continue on in my faith because I have new life and the Holy Spirit within me!"

When Barat\*\* placed his faith in Christ following Bible studies with a Christar worker, his wife responded with hostility. She abandoned him, taking their infant daughter and leaving him to raise a teenage son alone.

But God is giving Barat the strength to hold fast to the gospel and boldly declare his faith even though it costs him dearly. And, through his testimony, others are being drawn to the hope of Christ.

### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

When Eddie<sup>\*\*</sup> became a Christian, he was no longer welcome in his island community in Southeast Asia. Although the local leaders pushed him and his family out of the village, God gave him a desire to return and minister to his former neighbors.

Through a nonprofit started by Christar workers Nate and Liam, Eddie was able to serve his home village through helping to give them easy access to clean water and providing physical therapy to those living with disabilities. And, he earned a position of respect in the community that enabled him to more readily share the gospel.

As the villagers began to benefit from the work of the nonprofit, Eddie challenged them, "We did this because God showed His love to us in a very clear and very direct way. ... Now you've been shown that love, but it's not yours—it's from God. And so, what would God want you to do with it?"
